



In association with the Southern Rangelands Pastoral Alliance the College of Extension is delivering its *Rural Growth Program* for the Australian and State Government supported Farm Business Resilience Program in the Southern Rangelands and the Midwest.

The program takes pastoralists and other participants through a facilitated process, to better enable strategic management and prepare for and manage risk, adapt to a changing climate, and improve the economic, environmental and social resilience of the business – through four modules over two workshops that run for two days. *Rural Growth* will focus on the day to day, seasonal and year to year planning of pastoralists, with the aim of producing a longer term strategic plan and explore how to enable and fund the plan.

- The next generation of pastoralists Businesses needing to update a previous Strategic, Operational or Business Plan

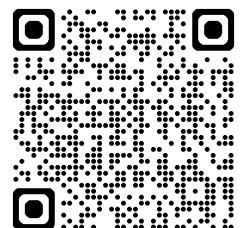
How much does it cost?

- The Australian and WA Governments funds two participants per business (\$10,000 in value)
- A co-contribution of \$500 is required (sponsored places are available)
- Supported places for the \$500 are available for those completing the program (i.e. a full refund of course fee) – ask about additional participants from each business
- Travel support of up to \$1,000 is available per eligible participant (conditions apply)

One on One facilitation is provided through the workshops and associated online sessions before, between and after the workshops by experienced facilitators with a wide range of experiences working in the Southern Rangelands.
